Mr Cashman would like to recognise the determination and fortitude of Year 9 Poppy G this week. He shared with me:

"...Poppy is currently wearing a boot on her right leg as she has fractures, ligament, muscle and tendon damage. Poppy lives for dancing and PE but cannot do either, without risking permanent damage and a life without either, if she doesn't follow medical advice.

When I say Poppy lives for dancing, I truly mean it. It is at the core of her life. Due to her injuries, Poppy has to watch and listen to her friends talking about dancing and PE, and yet, she comes in every day.

I cannot think of someone who is a better example of our school value 'burning brightly' right now."



Sustainability and Recycling

Senior Prefects Luca and Ellie had an important meeting with ELAT's Chief Operating Officer Andrew Frater on sustainability and recycling at Hall Mead.



We were delighted to learn the following:

- Hall Mead has solar panels installed on the roof in A Block. This creates 20% of the energy we use!



- 84% of everything we throw in our bins is recycled and the other 16% is made into fuel pellets. Our rubbish is sorted by a robot at an off-site specialised recycling plant. Check this video out to see it actually happening: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tulyOAq1PGk>
- All our lightbulbs are LED, meaning that they are, at least, 75% cheaper to run and more energy efficient
- So far, we have produced 23.5Mwh of power from the panels, the equivalent of 20% of our usage and saving 12,312.2kg of carbon dioxide emissions, equal to planting 754 trees!


The team faces St Martin's in the next round of the Essex Cup on Tuesday 17th October and we will be hoping for another strong performance.
