Knife Crime and Awareness Workshop

On Wednesday, 17th January, Year 9 took part in a special day of workshops related to Knife Crime run by the Metropolitan Police and emergency services, and funded by the London Borough of Havering for its secondary schools.

Students heard from a paramedic about how an instant, coherent 999 call with a precise location can save a life in many instances, how to apply pressure to a wound and also that there is NO safe part of the body in which someone can be stabbed.

From the Police, they heard about laws surrounding carrying weapons and the penalties for doing so and the effects on future life if having a conviction. It was hard-hitting and impactful and some students found the real life cases difficult to see and hear about, but all the facilitators praised our students for their engagement, respectful questioning and listening.

In the afternoon they then heard from Nathan about another perspective of knife crime: the effects on the family of losing a young person to knife crime and the ongoing impact on family life. Nathan shared the story of losing his youngest brother, after he was stabbed near their home on his way home from sixth form. Though over ten years' ago, the pain and loss was evident but Nathan wanted to show them how he has used his experience to save others and to influence young people to have better, safer lives. A memorable day and one which we are glad our students had the opportunity to take part in.





Holocaust Memorial Day 2024 Jewish Star

Havering's annual Holocaust Memorial Day Service will take place at 2pm on Sunday 21 January 2024 in Coronation Gardens, Main Road, Romford, ahead of the actual Holocaust Memorial Day on Saturday 27 January.

This important event gives us the opportunity to stop and remember the millions of people who have been murdered, or whose lives were changed beyond recognition during the Holocaust, Nazi persecution and in subsequent genocides including those in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.

The theme for this year's Holocaust Memorial Day is Fragility of Freedom, and marks the 30th anniversary of the genocide against the Tutsi in Rwanda. 49 years after the Holocaust ended, 19 years after the genocide in Cambodia, the world stood by as Hutu extremists shattered the fragile freedom in Rwanda, following decades of tension and violence, culminating in the murder of over one million Tutsis in just one hundred days.

Mrs Hallett will be attending this event on behalf of the school with some of our students.

Well done Esa keep up the hard work!














Reaching for the Mathematical Stars! 2024 Further Maths Year 10 Cohort

After a successful application, the following 18 students (including three Year 9s) have been selected to study the AQA Level 2 Certificate in Further Maths.


This is an extra qualification, equivalent to a GCSE, and ex-students have found it a helpful stepping stone into A Level Maths.
