Dear Parents/Carers,

After half term, Year 9 students begin an exciting stage of their educational journey at Hall Mead.

They will be attending a series of assemblies, designed specifically about the Key Stage 4/GCSE Options process, to prepare them for their Years 10—11 part of their studies.

In these assemblies, students will learn about the different courses that are on offer and the subject specifications.

Students will also be invited to attend an 'Options Q&A' with current KS4 students and teachers on **Thursday 7th March**, where they will be given the opportunity to talk in more detail about the different courses. This will be after school, between 3.15-3.45. <u>This is a student only event.</u>

A presentation will also be provided to parents/carers which outlines the entire process and timeline.

Our 'Hall Mead Options Booklet', detailing the KS4 curriculum, will be available after half-term and will be published on our website; the exact date for this will be confirmed after the break.

Parents/carers will also have an opportunity to speak in person to subject teachers at our Year 9 PTC on the 14th March.

Well done Felix! We are so proud of you and your honest conduct.




