River always goes above and beyond in her studies, hence why she is making so much progress. She is an incredible role model to others exemplifying our Hall Mead values on a daily basis.


I hope that River wears her pin with pride carrying with her how proud with are all of her.

# **Junior Maths Challenge**

On Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> April 2024, we had a selection of 69 students from Year 7 and 8 take part in the UKMT Junior Maths Challenge. This is a national competition that encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency to make students think.

To achieve a bronze award, students need to be in the top 50% of the country; to achieve a silver award, pupils will need to be in the top 16.7%; then finally to achieve a gold award, they are in the top 8.3% of students in the country.

34 out of the 69 students who participated achieved a medal. 11 Gold awards, 13 Silver, 14 Bronze with 4 students qualifying for the next round. Our best results EVER!

This could be through sponsorship, or through taking part in events that they are organising and preparing. It would be great if we could encourage them as much as possible.






As we know, social media can affect the mental health of our young people.


# **Engayne Primary School Need our Help!**




